University conducts examination at the end of each semester. Student evaluation is also done by giving assignments, seminars and quiz programmes.

# New system

In the Choice based credit system students performance is evaluated at the College level by giving class tests and 3 internal tests. Out of the 3 internal tests best two are considered and taken for internal assessment. Evaluation through Model examination, assignments, seminars quiz programmes and projects are continuously followed. We have admitted two students with total visual impairment in the year 2009-2010. A scriber is appointed to help them in writing the university Examination.
