ADMISSION PROCESS AND STUDENT PROFILE

Admissions to all the courses are made purely on the basis of merit, following the reservation policy and the norms prescribed by the Government of TamilNadu.

Admission Policy and Process

To begin with the admission process, the college made advertisement through mass Medias videlicet leading local dailies, local television network and institutional website.

To know about the academic profile of the college. The college issues the prospectus along with the application. Students are admitted to all courses as per the following reservation policy of the Government of TamilNadu.

The college admissions are done by the single window system. Merit list and selection list were prepared with the help of computer by the respective Head of the Department and were published both in the college and the Department notice boards. On the basis of Government norms our college enrolled the students subject wise. The entire admission process of the college is transparent and leaves no scope for any complaint from any quarters.

The courses are to be started from the academic year 2012 onwards. P.G. Department of HRD has been upgraded as a Research Centre.

3. INNOVATIONS IN CURRICULAR DESIGN AND TRANSACTION

Curriculum the pivot of education decides what the students should study. Curriculum development is essential for the overall development of students. Manonmaniam Sundaranar University introduced the Choice Based Credit System as per the recommendation of the TamilNadu State Council for Higher Education (TANSCHE)

Faculty members in the Board of studies of M.S.University attended the meetings of the standing committee and gave their valuable ideas in designing the curriculum and framing the syllabus. Skill based subject, Non major electives and applied subjects electives are included in the present syllabus.

All skill based subjects and non – major electives are designed in such a way that they facilitate horizontal movement. For example a student of B.Sc Physics studies “Numerical ability” offered by the Department of Mathematics.

4. INTER DISCIPLINARY SUBJECTS

Social Value Education and Environmental Studies are gives as inter – disciplinary subjects.

5. EXAMINATION REFORMS IMPLEMENTED

In the Choice Based Credit System students performance is evaluated at the college level by giving periodical class test and three Internal test. According to the University norms 25 marks are allotted for internal assessment and 75 marks for university examination. 20 marks for internal test and 5 marks for assignment. Out of the three internal test average of the best two are considered and taken as internal assessment.

- a. Centralized model examination based on the University evaluation based is followed. Answer scripts are valued and the progress reports are sent to parents of the students.

- b. University conducts examination at the end of the each semester.
- c. For Science Students practical examination will be conducted at the end of the academic year.
- d. For major subject project, group projects are given. They are evaluated by the external examiners by conducting viva voce.
- e. For visually impaired students, scribes are appointed to help them in writing the university examinations.
